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Nexus Infrastructure to Supply On-Call Services to Dulles Toll Road

Nexus Infrastructure LLC, an infrastructure advisory firm based in Washington DC that specializes in transportation project finance and operations efficiency, recently announced that it was selected in June by the Metropolitan Washington Airports Authority (MWAA) as part of a multidisciplinary team to supply On-Call for Planning and Programming Services for the Dulles Toll Road in Virginia. Nexus has partnered with Vanasse Hangen Brustlin, Inc. (VHB), a leading engineering, planning, and applied sciences firm that provides integrated transportation, land development, and environmental services, for the multi-year effort.

MWAA, operator of the Reagan National and Dulles International airports that, together, served over 40 million passengers last year, officially assumed responsibility for the operations of the Dulles Toll Road on November 1, 2008, through a groundbreaking agreement with the Virginia Department of Transportation. Under a 50-year lease with VDOT, MWAA will operate and maintain the eight-lane, 12-mile Dulles Toll Road that extends from Interstate 495 to Route 28.

MWAA has secured the services of Nexus and its partners to provide a comprehensive range of planning tasks to advance the phasing and implementation of projects in the operative Capital Improvement Program (CIP). As part of the project team led by VHB, Nexus will provide complementary expertise in areas such as financial, business, and strategic planning and benchmarking. As its first task, Nexus conducted an economic impact assessment for a \$150 million capital improvement project for the Toll Road that is expected to reduce congestion and improve traffic flow. This analysis was included in the Transportation Investment Generating Economic Recovery (TIGER) Program, part of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA), grant applications submitted by MWAA to the US Department of Transportation last month.
